It's considered the most accessible of all dances, with participants moving in two long facing lines or in groups. Bring a partner or come alone. Wear comfortable clothes and shoes; no perfumes or strong scents, please. Next dance is Saturday, Nov. 5, 6:30 in the Public Library. We're making this an ongoing activity; watch Nov. More FALL INTO STREET DANCE - WestSound bandleader/keyboardist/vocalist Randy Weston has played cruise ships and the hotel circuit as a solo and ensemble artist. Vocalist Gina Duke brings sensational sound, personality, and moves to the show. Guitarist/vocalist Oscar Weston engages and delights audiences with his Marvin Gaye and Sam Cooke voice.
